Speaker Backgrounds:

Gregg Levoy

Gregg Levoy is a full-time lecturer and seminar-leader in the business, educational and human-potential arenas. He has keynoted and presented workshops at the Smithsonian Institution, the National League of Cities, Microsoft, American Express, the Universities of California/Arizona/Nevada/Wisconsin/Texas and others, the American Counseling Association, the National Career Development Association, Esalen Institute, Omega Institute, and others, and has been a frequent guest of the media, including ABC-TV, CNN, NPR and PBS. His workshop today is entitled *Callings: In Search of an Authentic Life*. Any leap you want to make in your personal or professional life that will align or re-align you with your passion and sense of purpose, with your deepest values, with a fit between who you are and what you do is, by definition, a calling — an urging from the deep self that tells you what it will take to make your life literally "come true."

Jeffrey Wattles

Jeffrey Wattles teaches philosophy and religion at Kent State University in project-centered courses that promote transformation in students' lives. His first book, *The Golden Rule*, explored the diverse cultural histories and interdisciplinary research on the principle, "relate with others as you want others to relate with you." He is presently revising for publication another book: a philosophy of living centered on truth, beauty, and goodness.

Lin Morel

Lin Morel has a Doctorate in Spiritual Science, Master of Spiritual Psychology and Applied Theology, certification as a spiritual director with Christian Formation and Direction Ministries, and certification as a teacher of Native American culture by the Seneca Indian Historical Society. Lin teaches people how to connect with their own inner guidance, wisdom, and talent, assists individuals as they move beyond limitations to a place of authentic living, and designs and delivers "intensive" retreats for individuals that are a "boot camp" for the soul - assisting individuals in releasing blocks, traumas and other life experiences that are limiting their ability to connect with their own authentic creativity, divinity and purpose.

Connie Stomper holds a masters and doctorate from Columbia University in the area of education and human development. Currently she is completing a Doctor of Spiritual Science degree at Peace Theological Seminary where she also earned a Master of Theology in Practical Spirituality. The title of her treatise and focus of her upcoming book is *My Life is For Me: Fully and Freely, Living and Loving the Blessing 'I AM.'* Connie is an ordained minister in the Movement of Spiritual Inner Awareness, and has traveled to more than twenty-five countries on trips with a focus of Individual and World Peace. She held positions as a teacher, an academic dean, a manager in business; has had over fifteen years experience consulting and training in schools, businesses, and non-profit organizations, specializing in teambuilding, diversity and participatory management; and writes curriculum for major educational publishers.
